



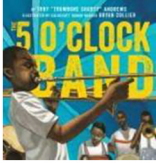

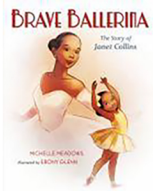


A Is For Activist (Hardcover (Trade))

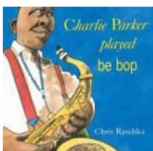


Brave Ballerina: The Story of Janet Collins (Hardcover (Trade))

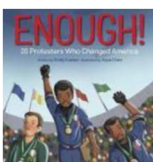

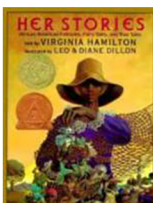


Enough!: 20 Protesters Who Changed America (Hardcover (Trade))

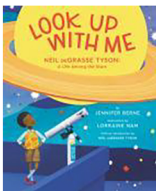


Let the Children March (Hardcover (Trade))

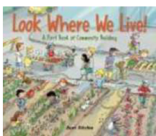

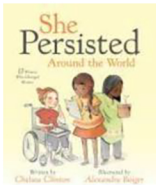


Planting Stories: The Life of Librarian and Storyteller Pura Belpre (Hardcover (Trade))

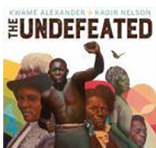

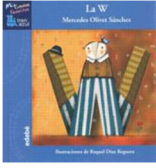


Undeclared (Hardcover (Trade))
